Four Card Poker

About Four Card Poker

Four Card Poker, by Shufflemaster (NOTE: Is this a credit that is necessary?) is a variation of Three Card Poker with these two differences: There is no Dealer qualifying hand, and a Player may raise up to three times the Ante.

Like Three Card Poker, the rankings of the hands are different from five or seven card poker games.

How to Play

A Player gets to choose his best four cards out of the five he is dealt. The Dealer is dealt a sixth card and selects his best four from his hand.

From high to low, the hands are ranked as follows: Four of a kind, Straight Flush, Three of a kind, Flush, Straight, Two Pair, Pair, high card.

The Player making the Ante bet can choose whether to fold or make an additional bet, either matching the Ante or betting up to three times the Ante.

Another betting option is available called the Aces Up bet. This is based only on the Player's best four card hand. See below for payouts on this bet.

All bets are lost if the Player folds.

Player discards one of his five cards and keeps his best four.

After betting is done, the Dealer turns over his hand and chooses the best four from his six cards.

The highest hand is the winner. If the Player's hand is higher or equal to the Dealer's hand, he wins the Ante and Raise at 1 to 1 (even money).

The Player loses his Ante and Raise bets if the Dealer's hand is higher.

Bonus Payout

If a Player has three of a kind or more he wins whether he beats the Dealer's hand or not. Payoffs are based on amount of Ante bet.

Payoffs
