

Bet on four numbers that form a square (corner bet). Chips are placed where the four numbers meet. This pays 8 to 1.

Bet on two adjoining rows of numbers (line bet). Chips are placed on one of the two outside lines where the two rows meet. Pays 6 to 1.

There is also one five number wager you can place. It is 0, 00, 1, 2 and 3. The payoff is 6 to 1. Chips are placed at the corner of where 0, 1 and the first 12 numbers cross.

Roulette

About Roulette

Roulette has a historical tradition that dates back to the 1600s where it was introduced in France.

How to Play

All activity is centered around the Roulette Wheel where as many as eight Players play against the House. The operator (“Croupier”) of the wheel spins it and then tosses a small ball or marble onto the spinning wheel. Wagers are placed on where the ball will land. The wheel has a total of 38 slots, or pockets, with numbers from 1 to 36 and a 0 and 00. Each number has a color. In the U.S., a 38-slot wheel is usually the standard while European countries often have a 37-slot wheel with only one zero. The numbers are in an ordered pattern with a balance between red and black, high and low, odd and even.

You place your bets with special Roulette Chips which you buy at the table. The chips may be purchased in denominations from \$1 to \$100. You will be given chips of a certain color and you will be the only person at the table playing with those chips.

How to Bet

You can bet that the winning number will be either Red or Black by placing your bet in the area where these two words are written (0 and 00 are in green but there is no color betting on these numbers). The 36 numbers are divided evenly between Red and Black. The odds on these two bets are 1 to 1 or even money (a \$5 bet wins \$5).

You can bet on the number being odd or even (0 and 00 are not included) by putting chips on the odd or even squares. The odds on this bet is also 1 to 1 or even money.

You can bet that the number will be anywhere from 1 to 12 or 19 to 36. This is called high-low betting. The odds on this bet are also 1 to 1. You can bet by columns of numbers. At one end of the table you will find boxes with “2 to 1” written in them. Each of these are lined up with a column of numbers. Place your bet on one of these “2-1” boxes. If any number in that column comes up, you win. The payoff on this is 2 to 1.

You can bet on the first 12 numbers, the second 12 numbers or the third 12 numbers. Place your bets in the boxes marked 1st 12, 2nd 12 or 3rd 12. The odds on this bet are 2 to 1.

Bet on a single number (straight-up bet). This pays 35 to 1.

Bet two adjacent numbers (split bet). If either of your numbers come up, the payout is 17 to 1. Place your bet on the line between the two numbers.

Bet on a row of three numbers (street bet). Payoff is 11 to 1 if any of the three come up. Chips are placed on outer edge of the row.
